

Personal data breach reporting

ALL PERSONAL DATA BREACHES MUST BE REPORTED to the Information Commissioner

unless the controller can demonstrate that the loss/disclosure etc. of the personal data affected by the breach is **unlikely to pose A risk*** to the rights and freedoms of the data subject(s)

NOTIFY DATA SUBJECT(S)

if there is a **HIGH RISK** to individuals unless that high risk is unlikely to arise due to mitigating actions taken by the controller to ensure the high risk will no longer materialise, or which render the personal data unintelligible

* **Risk is not defined but takes natural meaning. Examples include:** Physical, material or non-material damage; ID theft/fraud; Limitation of rights; Discrimination; Financial loss; Damage to reputation; Loss of professional confidentiality; Any other significant social or economic disadvantage
